

Portugal lifts all coronavirus entry restrictions

From July 1, 2022, tourists do not need tests or vaccination certificates to enter Portugal

The authorities of another European country have lifted all coronavirus entry restrictions and lifted all anti-COVID entry restrictions for foreign tourists from July 1, 2022.

About this writes the publication <u>Diário da República</u>, citing a statement from the Civil Aviation Authority.

According to the new rules, foreign travelers, including citizens of Russia, arriving in Portugal are no longer required to present a COVID-19 vaccination certificate, a certificate of illness, or a PCR test.

The requirement for mandatory wearing of masks remained only in public transport, medical institutions and nursing homes.

Citizens of Russia to enter Portugal will only need a visa and a passport. However, there are still no direct flights to the country, you can only get there with transfers.
